Most of their meat is reared locally. Stephens make their own pasties, pork pies, sausage rolls and meat pies and also sell Cheddar cheese and locally made preserves. Bridie's Yard

Not-for-profit local organic food co-operative run by a team of volunteers providing affordable food for all. Bridie's Yard sell fresh local vegetables, raw food brownies and snacks, grains, pulses, fruits and nuts, superfoods, Pukka herbal teas, baked beans, eggs, honey, herbs and spices. For the sum of one penny you can join a local revolution in food purchasing. Once you join, you are responsible for weighing and paying for your food yourself. You purchase and consume what you need, and choose it yourself. Brown paper bags are provided, but you are welcome to bring your own box or bag instead.
