Origins

Fish and chips is a hot dish consisting of fried fish in batter served with chips. The dish originated in England and is an example of culinary fusion of its two main ingredients, each brought by immigrants. The earliest known shops opened in the 1860s in London. By the 1930s there were over 35,000 fish and chip shops across the UK falling to about 10,000 by 2009. The British government safeguarded the supply of fish and chips during World War I and World War II; it was one of the few foods in the UK not subject to rationing.

Traditional Fish and Chip Shops

If it is a tradtional fish and chip shop you are after, Glastonbury has 3 – all 3 do take-away and one (Knights) has a restaurant:

 Knights of Glastonbury – Established in 1909, Knights is the oldest established fish and chip restaurant in the UK that has remained in the same family throughout its existence and is the oldest established business in Glastonbury. Serving traditional fish and chips, Knights specialities include home-made fish cakes and pork faggots or for vegetarians, the spicy bean burger. Knights also offers gluten-free fish and chips on Thursdays. Knights has won many awards over the years and was featured in The Times 30 best places to eat fish and chips. Knights has a take away service and a restaurant, but we recommend you enjoy your meal and the ambiance in the restaurant at the rear accompanied by a glass of local farmhouse cider – either Hecks or Wilkins.
